

# Student Internships at Equal Rights Washington



Equal Rights Washington welcomes interns during the summer and school year. It's a great opportunity to experience the inner workings of a major issue-oriented political campaign, and to make a difference for LGBT individuals and families through your day-to-day work.

Interns will advance ERW's grassroots lobbying campaign. Interns support the work of ERW, including assistance with outreach to volunteers, organizing field activities, and responding to the needs of activists. In addition, interns will assist as needed with research, database management and other necessary tasks. Interns will have the opportunity to work closely with ERW staff and volunteers, and to engage other young adults in similar activism. Some interns will work to help elect fair-minded legislators. In addition, the internships will include some educational content, including access to local speakers on LGBT issues.

ERW seeks students who understand and support our mission, are hard-working, are able to successfully complete projects, and are comfortable using computers.

Unfortunately, ERW is unable to provide funding for interns. Some students may be able to arrange for funding and/or course credit from their school. Time requirements are flexible, ranging from 5 to 15 hours per week during the school year and winter and from 15-40 hours during the summer.

Internships are available at ERW's Seattle office. There are also opportunities to work in the offices of coalition partners throughout the state. The ERW office is located in Capitol Hill, easily accessible by public transportation.
